

**DISTANCE:** 27km round trip

Start your journey at the Wonders of Wynyard Exhibition and Visitor Information Centre, where the Veteran Car display is a must see. It's Australia's largest private collection of veteran cars and includes the equal oldest Ford in the world. You'll be charmed by the rows of pre-1930 vehicles, and inspired by the passion of one man who restored them all to their former glory. Grab your maps (and some locally made treasures) and head on your way!

There are around 10km of walking tracks along the Inglis River in Wynyard – ask at the Visitor Information Centre for a map of entry points and walking distances.



The beach and cliff faces at Fossil Bluff reveal millions of years of history, like an ancient, geographical library. There's a 15 minute walk to the lookout that will reward you with spectacular views in all directions. Low tide is the best time to wander along the beach and search for evidence of life from millions of years past.

Fossilised remains found at Fossil Bluff in the mid 1800's were recorded at the time as Australia's oldest known marsupial. Found by an anonymous beachcomber, *Wynyardia Bassiana* has been dated to the early Miocene period making it around 23 million years old.







On the drive up the hill to the lookout you are surrounded by lush green farmland with rich red basalt soils that nourish a multitude of colourful crops. You'll pass the Van Dieman Quality Bulbs, where during flowering season (Sept-Oct), you can call in and literally tiptoe through the tulips! Even if it's not tulip time, chances

are the fields atop Table Cape will be awash with colour from another seasonal crop such as Iris, Lilliums, Hyacinths, Poppies or Pyrethrum. At the Lookout you can literally see for miles – on a good day all the way to the mouth of the Tamar River (90km) to the east and inland to the South is Valentines Peak (45km).
